OBSERVATIONS

Sarah Jones saith I am 73 years old – I am the Widow of William Jones – he was an acknowledged parishioner of St Winnow having obtained a settlement therein by Hiring & Service with the late Mr. Hugo of Trewall in that Parish – I have resided within Bodmin Union since 1815 with the exception of Five years, from 1851 to 1856 when I lived in the parish of Menheniot with my daughter - & wholly supported myself by labour – I have not done any act to gain a settlement for myself. I am now chargeable to Lostwithiel.

I certify that the foregoing is a true Statement of the Grounds of Irremovability of the above-mentioned Pauper so far as I have been able to ascertain the facts.

The Complaint of ***Henry Ham Kidd*** one of the Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of ***Lostwithiel within the Borough of Lostwithiel*** in the said County of ***Cornwall***, made on behalf of the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish of ***Lostwithiel*** and with their assent, unto ***Charles Row Esquire*** and ***John Bower Clerk*** two of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the

said ~~County of~~ ***Borough*** at ***the Guild Hall within and for*** ~~in the said County of~~ ***the same*** this ***18th*** day of ***March*** in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and ***sixty four*** who saith: That ***Sarah Jones Widow*** hath lately come to inhabit and ***is*** now inhabiting in the said Parish of ***Lostwithiel*** not having gained a Legal Settlement there, nor produced any Certificate acknowledging ***her*** to be settled elsewhere, and that the said ***Sarah Jones is*** now actually chargeable to, and ***is*** now receiving Relief from, the said Parish of ***Lostwithiel*** the said ***Sarah Jones*** not having become chargeable in respect of Relief made necessary by Sickness or Accident, and

that the said **Sarah Jones** hath not resided in the said Parish of **Lostwithiel** for ~~Five~~ **Three** Years next preceding the Application now made for an Order or Warrant for the Removal of the said **Sarah Jones**

The said **Henry Ham Kidd** on behalf of the said Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish of **Lostwithiel** and with their assent, therefore prays that the said **Sarah Jones** may be examined as to the place of **her** Legal Settlement, and that an Order or Warrant may be granted for **her** Removal to the Parish of **St Winnow** in the **said County of Cornwall**, as the place of **her** Legal Settlement, and further to be dealt with according to Law.

Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish of Lostwithiel, that the said Sarah Jones hath come to
inhabit and is now inhabiting in the said Parish of Lostwithiel not having gained a legal
settlement there nor having produced any certificate acknowledging her to be settled
elsewhere, and that the said Sarah Jones is now actually chargeable to and in receipt of relief
from the said parish of Lostwithiel; the said Sarah Jones being by reason of sickness and infirmity
unable to be brought up to the Petty Sessions to be examined as to her settlement**

The said Sarah Jones upon her oath saith as follows

**I am the widow of William Jones. I am in the 73rd year of my age. I was born as I have heard &
believe in the parish of Morwenstow. At the age of 23 I married my late husband at Stonehouse
in the County of Devon. He was a private in the Marines (I think I was married 5th November). He
died 14 years since in St Winnow. He belonged as I have heard & believe to St Winnow. He lived
with Mr. Hugo 4 years as an hired servant, before the year 1834, the latter part of which was
served in St Winnow. At that time he was single & unmarried & before he went into the Marines.
Before I came to reside in this parish I had pay from St Winnow for 9½ years some 4 of which
were continuously. I am now chargeable to the parish of Lostwithiel. I came to reside in this**

parish the first week in November 1863. My husband was admitted to belong to St Winnow having repeatedly received relief from that Parish and at his death was buried at their expense.

of the Parish of Lostwithiel. The Pauper Sarah Jones, before her marriage with her late husband
William Jones called Sarah Berry, before and at the time of the making of the present complaint
was and still is chargeable to the said Parish of Lostwithiel and also then was and still continues
to be in the actual receipt of relief therefrom. The said Pauper hath not resided in the said Parish
of Lostwithiel for Three years next before the present application for an Order for her removal.**

**I produce a Certificate of the Registry of the Marriage of the said William Jones and Sarah
Berry whereby it appears they were married in the Chapel of the Parish of East Stonehouse in**

the County of Devon on the 5th day of November in the year 1813 I procured it at the said Parish of East Stonehouse I compared it with the entry in the Register of Marriages there kept and it is correct

1st April 1864 Notice of Removal Order & Grounds - Lostwithiel to St Winnow (Sarah Jones)

Parish of Lostwithiel within the Borough of Lostwithiel in the County of Cornwall

As to the removal of Sarah Jones Widow a Pauper

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Winnow in the County of Cornwall

Take Notice that the above named Sarah Jones now residing in this Parish has become and now is chargeable to the said Parish of Lostwithiel and is now receiving relief from the same Parish not having become chargeable in respect of relief made necessary by Sickness or Accident And that an Order of Justices has been obtained for her removal to your Parish of Saint Winnow as her last place of legal Settlement (a Duplicate of which Order is herewith sent)

And Take Notice that the following are the grounds of the said removal including the particulars of the Settlement relied upon by us

For that the said Sarah Jones before her marriage called Sarah Berry is the Widow of William Jones late of the Parish of Saint Winnow a Private in the Marines deceased to whom she was married in the Church or Chapel of East Stonehouse in the County of Devon on the Fifth day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirteen

And for that the said William Jones previously to his said Marriage with the said Sarah Jones being then single and unmarried and without child or children acquired and gained a Settlement in the said Parish of Saint Winnow by hiring and service with one Thomas Hugo (since deceased) there that he afterwards entered the service of the Marines and never did any Act to gain any other Settlement but was subsequently by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish of Saint Winnow allowed and admitted to belong to the same and at his death was buried at their expence

And for that the said Pauper since the death of her said late husband William Jones hath been by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish of Saint Winnow recognized allowed and admitted to belong to the same and for a series of years hath by them been treated as an Inhabitant thereof and been relieved supported maintained and provided for accordingly with the full consent and approbation of the same Parish of Saint Winnow

And also for that the said Pauper hath come to inhabit and is now inhabiting in the said Parish of Lostwithiel not having gained a legal Settlement there nor produced any Certificate acknowledging her to be settled elsewhere and before and at the time of making the said Order of Justices was and still continues to be actually chargeable to the said Parish of Lostwithiel and is now receiving relief therefrom

And for that the said Pauper hath not resided in the said Parish of Lostwithiel for Three years next preceding the application for an Order or Warrant for her removal

And Take Notice that unless Notice of Appeal against the said Order be received by us within Twenty one days from the sending hereof or (in case of your application for a copy of the Depositions upon which such Order was made) within a further period of Fourteen days after the sending of such Copy, No Appeal against such Order shall afterwards be allowed and the said Pauper will be removed to your said Parish of Saint Winnow in pursuance of the said Order
